Chairman Mariano called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

Ms. Grimes called the roll. All Commissioners were. Commissioner Bradford attended the meeting virtually. Commissioner Weightman arrived virtually to the meeting after roll call.

Ms. Kristen Quintrall spoke regarding her attendance at a previous meeting, the underdevelopment between State Road 54, Overpass, Curley and Handcart, the Watergrass Parkway, the effects of construction on the roadways, a possible construction truck route, the conditions of Old Bridge Road, a possible extension, and the Golf Cart Ordinance.

Commissioner Oakley stated that Mr. Nick Uhren, Engineering Services Director, would meet with Ms. Quintrall.

Ms. Tami Cook spoke regarding a Truck Ordinance on Old Bridge Road, lack of enforcement from the Sheriff's Office, the truck traffic, Old Bridge Road conditions, requirements of the developer to monitor traffic congestion on Overpass Road and Old Bridge Road, that First Responders were unable to arrive to a traffic accident on Old Bridge Road, school bus stops on Watergrass Parkway and children who rode bikes to school, the extension project on Overpass Road to Handcart, and a petition from Pasco County residents.

- Commissioner Oakley spoke regarding the reopening of Hugh Embry Library that was held on Thursday, September 21st and that he was thankful for the involvement to help.
- He displayed photos and spoke regarding the Tampa Bay Water 25th Anniversary Celebration that was held on September 22nd and 23rd, a tour of the Regional Reservoir and Surface Water Treatment Plant, and the previous film.

Commissioner Starkey noted a trip to Indiana with Staff, the manufacturing program, and the training equipment.

Chairman Mariano noted that it was a tremendous night and that the presentations were amazing.

- Commissioner Starkey spoke regarding the Food Truck Ordinance and to tweak the Landscaping Grant to maybe include affordable housing projects.

She noted that they had three million dollars in the Trust Fund and that it grew steadily, and that money needed to go back into the community to get trees planted.

Commissioner Oakley noted that there was money there for small businesses as well.

Commissioner Starkey noted that there was a grant program for people who got caught in the 50 percent rule. She noted that there were many places where trees could be planted, that wildlife lived in oak trees, that they needed to put the tree canopy back in, that one way to cool things down would be to put the tree canopy back in, shading parking lots, shading houses, and shading walkways.

Chairman Mariano spoke regarding an affordable housing project in Hudson that wanted to get trees, but they struggled. He requested that Mr. Carballa get with Staff for less strict language and noted that there should be trees with affordable housing, any County Park, and businesses that needed help.

Commissioner Oakley noted that there were funds to help with landscaping but a lot of people did not know about it. He noted that it should be explained in the advertisement on the website.

Chairman Mariano noted that the purpose of the Ordinance was to put a tax on trees that were being taken down so that they could be replanted. He noted that when businesses came in, they should help them with an incentive and an easy way so that it did not come from the general fund.

Commissioner Starkey noted that it could go in any County owned property and redevelopment, that it should expand to affordable housing, and for Habitat.

- Commissioner Starkey spoke regarding a text from Secretary Gwynn in regards to holding the Regional MPO MOU at the upcoming MPO meeting.

Mr. Steinsnyder spoke regarding something he had received regarding the MOU, that it had no legal review, and that it was not really an MOU.

Commissioner Starkey noted that it would be voted on by Hillsborough and Pinellas.

Discussion was held regarding the research and that it was tweaked at the TMA to be better.

Mr. Steinsnyder noted that the problem would be if it was a Memorandum of Understanding, why would it have venue of provisions. He noted that if it was a Memorandum of Understanding it was aspirational.

Discussion followed regarding Hillsborough and Pinellas voting to study it and that it was not a final document.

- Commissioner Starkey presented photos and spoke regarding the Burger King on U.S. 19. She noted her appreciation for Staff for working with the owner.
- Commissioner Starkey spoke regarding golf carts and the entrance at Gulf Harbors. She noted that the Sheriff's Office had been giving tickets to golf cart residents because of the frontage road.

Discussion was held regarding the frontage road; to allow it to be golf cart accessible; a map of the area; and Floramar Terrace and U.S. 19.

Mr. Steinsnyder noted that it had to go through the golf cart authorization process.

Discussion was held regarding City lines; the 100-foot strip; who was issuing citations; that it could be added in; and the District where it was located.

- Commissioner Starkey spoke regarding a future event at Starkey TLC.
- Commissioner Starkey spoke regarding conversations with Ms. Deeb and noted that the Animal Services needed a facility, the funding for the facility, and grant funding.

Mr. Erik Breitenbach, Assistant County Administrator for Internal Services Administration, spoke regarding the funding and grants, the FY 23 and FY 24 budgets, the design money that was set aside, and the design of the Animal Services Facility.

Discussion was held regarding the amount for the design and the budgeted amount.

Mr. Carballa noted that it was a conceptual design and that there were efficiencies if the design was done all at one time, a possible cash flow issue, and the amount needed to take what was done and turn it into buildable plans which then would become a shovel ready project. He also noted that it had to be removed from the FY 24 budget and that one-time Capital expenses would be cancelled first.

Mr. Breitenbach confirmed and noted what was budgeted in the FY 23, a task order to accomplish conceptual design, schematic drawings, all necessary surveying and geotechnical testing of the soil was issued in FY 23 and what it amounted to, and that the balance was carried forward but there were amounts needed to finish the design.

Discussion was held regarding the budget; a will in the Legislature to try and get it funded; what it would take to get a design where they could have a shovel ready project; and if the Board was looking for a recommendation to replace or a budget amendment.

- Commissioner Starkey noted that they previously approved money to fix the medians and the roads, and asked where they were with the improvements.

Discussion was held regarding the amount in the budget and that design work was being done.

Mr. Branford Adumuah, Assistant County Administrator for Public Infrastructure Administration, noted that the architect was in the process of redesigning the median and that they would come back and construct from the design. He noted the last time they met regarding replacing and fixing the median, that it needed to be redesigned by a landscape architect, and that the contract had been issued.

Discussion was held regarding the architect in the design process; if they would see action in FY24; the 5 year plan; the money that was given in the FY23 budget; that the schedule would be brought back; effects that delayed the design; when the design would be finished; the timeline; a new program; and the budgeting.

Mr. Carballa noted that if it was in a Capital Fund it would carry forward and the funds would be available for immediate use.

Discussion was held regarding the amount for the design.

Commissioner Starkey noted the amount that was paid to a landscape architect to design the landscaping for Ridge Road and that there was a lawsuit with a contractor.

Mr. Carballa confirmed that the design was underway.

Miscellaneous Business - District Four - Commissioner Bradford

- Absent.

Miscellaneous Business - District Five - Commissioner Mariano

- Chairman Mariano spoke regarding the Legislative Delegation, discussions that were held regarding if they were going to fund projects and wanted to make sure that they would be shovel ready, roads being ready to go, that the design was key to get them funded, and previous trouble with SWFWMD projects.

Discussion was held regarding the list that was provided and whether they were shovel ready.

Mr. Ralph Lair, Intergovernmental Affairs Officer, spoke regarding the projects that were selected were all shovel ready and noted the projects that were selected. He noted that they also included the sidewalk on the westside and that the sponsors decided to not do the sidewalk.

Discussion was held regarding the location of the projects that were selected.

Mr. Lair noted that Representative Maggard had not named a project by name and had stated when they went to Tallahassee, he would like to make sure to complete projects that were previously funded from previous years.

Discussion was held regarding the outstanding projects; Handcart Road and the updates on that project; and that it was a water and sewer line.

- Chairman Mariano spoke regarding a recommended LDC change to allow RV boat storage along the Suncoast Parkway, and that the covered and open storage was prohibited on transit corridors within 300 feet of the corridor.

Commissioner Starkey noted that the reason they had the rule was because the Suncoast Corridor was considered a scenic corridor and that rules come from the State for designated scenic corridors.

Discussion was held regarding that Pasco County had the scenic corridor; that tree buffers should be left; and that there was industrial on certain parts.

Mr. Nectarious Pittos, Planning and Development, spoke regarding what the prohibition was about, a certain Code section which noted that covered and open storage was not allowed within 300 feet of transit corridors, what transit

corridors were, what the intent was when the Ordinance was created, what the preservation of the 300 feet was, and that there was an aesthetic reason.

Discussion was held regarding the number of jobs generated from a storage facility and that it was next to the Del Web site that would have a retirement community.

Mr. Pittos noted that Section 1105 was added in 2019, that there was an amendment to the Land Development Code that related to self-storage facilities, and the ability to do outdoor storage in different zoning districts.

Extensive discussion was held regarding taking out every tree and landscaping; no requirements inside; that via a Special Exception they could require additional landscaping as a condition of approval; someone wanting to sell their business and turn it into an RV boat storage; land banking; the parcel size; the scenic protection; to keep a buffer and tree canopy; that the Suncoast had a buffer built into the right-of-way and that the Land Development Code would add an additional buffer on the site; height of trees; the industrial land; Gary Plastics; height restrictions; and the industrial corridor.

Commissioner Starkey noted that she would vote against it, that Staff would make sure there were thick buffers, and that the area should be preserved.

Chairman Mariano requested that Mr. Pittos brings back comparisons, what the corridor means, visuals and street signs, and to bring it back as an agenda item. He also noted a specific extension of the industrial property up to the area so jobs would be supported.

Discussion was held regarding what should go on the property and to improve and control the aesthetics.

Mr. Pittos noted that he could bring back a report on what they regulated regarding open storage, the existing storage on the ground in the area, and that an amendment could be made if needed.

Discussion was held regarding the scenic corridor rules on Suncoast Parkway and that it could restrict jobs.

- Chairman Mariano noted that he missed the Premier Opening but attended the Brownfield meeting, the meeting was phenomenal and that the Staff was on top of Brownfields, and that the industrial park in Hudson had a change to get added.

- Chairman Mariano spoke regarding a homeless camp to the east of Heavenly Way, the effects of it, and requested the team looked at it.
- Chairman Mariano noted that on May 9th and 10th the Regional Resiliency Leadership Summit from the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Coalition would be starting, their fliers were out, and that there had been a lot of participation.

Miscellaneous Business - County Administrator

- Mr. Carballa noted that on C11 there was a scrivener's error and needed to formally advise the Board, the September 3, 2024 hearing at 9:00 a.m. was incorrectly labeled with the location of New Port Richey, but the meeting should be correctly labeled to reflect Dade City.

Approved to accept and correct the item to change the location to Dade City with Commissioner Bradford absent from the vote.

- Mr. Carballa recognized Dr. Whitney Elmore, Cooperative Extension and Ms. Sonya Nace, who would receive the Excellence in Community Development Team Award. He also spoke regarding a course that teaches how to recognize signs and what to do to help.

Miscellaneous Business - County Attorney

- Mr. Steinsnyder noted that he needed a vote or at least a consensus for a litigation assessment meeting. He noted that the Board authorized him to engage outside Counsel for the PFAS Litigation. He noted that there were settlements proposed and that he proposed to schedule it at the November 14th meeting.

Discussion was held regarding whether it would be done during lunch or after morning business.

Miscellaneous Business - Clerk and Comptroller

- Ms. Grimes spoke regarding a new partnership with Amscot, that when a customer tried to cash out a check, Amscot could see if there were any pending traffic infraction cases with the office. She noted that Amscot was able to process payment for that infraction and that the partnership allowed an expansion of services to customers without an increase in costs.

- She noted that the Clerk sent an email to the Board, a letter that was sent that requested clarification on the budget cuts from the Budget Public Hearings on September 19th, that a revised Table 2 was submitted to the Clerk's Office after the Budget Hearing, and that it was unclear if the expenditure cuts were consistent with the intent of the Board's motion at the hearing. She also noted that it appeared 100 percent of the Board's cuts were taken out Reserves, while the Constitutionals cuts were taken out of their Operating Budget, and that the Clerk was asking for clarification.

Mr. Carballa noted that it was cut evenly and that he was advised to use his discretion on the shares. He noted that he elected to take the Board's cuts from Reserves with the intent of a replenishment of an increase in Taxable Assessed Value for the following year. He noted that if the Board would like to take the cuts operationally, he would.

Discussion was held regarding where the cuts were taken from.

Commissioner Mariano noted for clarity, that they had given Mr. Carballa flexibility to do what he wants to with the budget, whether he would take from reserves.

Ms. Grimes clarified that the Board pulls from the Reserves while the Constitutionals pulled from the Operating Budget.

Miscellaneous Business – Sheriff

- Absent.
